**Newark Airport:**

Upon exiting airport follow signs for Route 22 West. Proceed 7.5 miles on Route 22 West, Hotel will be on the right.

**Garden State Parkway, Southbound:**

Take exit 140A and follow signs for Route 22 West. Proceed 4.5 miles West on Route 22, Hotel will be on the right. Northbound: Take exit 140 and follow signs for Route 22 West, proceed on 22 West 4.5 miles.

**NJ Turnpike (US Route 95):**

For Northbound travelers take exit 11 to the Garden State Parkway North, Exit at 140 to Route 22 West and proceed 4.5 miles, Hotel will be on the right. For Southbound travelers take exit 14 (Newark Airport & Route 22), proceed 7.5 miles on Route 22 West and the Hotel will be on the right.

Follow Route 1&9 South to Route 22 West and proceed 7.5 miles Westbound on Route 22 to hotel on right.

**Verazano Narrows:**

Follow Route 278 Westbound across the Goethals Bridge to Route 95 North. Follow Route 95 North to exit 14 to Route 22 West and proceed 7.5 miles to hotel on right.

It promises to be another memorable evening to visit with friends and reminisce about our college days.


